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APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Attend one orientation meeting
2. Make a commitment to actively participate on your project and to be willing to invite family, friends, and neighbors to help.
3. Complete an application. (homeowners only/may be done at any time following orientation meeting.)
4. Participate in two other ALL4ONE related activities and obtain validated "Participation Certificates" issued for your involvement. For FUND, Inc. project dates, contact your Program Director or the FUND, Inc. office at 559-237-4741.
5. Upon completion of 1-4 above, your application will be certified.

Note: completing the above steps and being certified does not guarantee that a project will be accepted or acted on.

CERTIFICATION PROCESS

1. The Program Directors committee, made up of neighborhood resident representatives, will review all certified applications and make decisions on acceptance or denial, scope of work to be done, project date, and outline the specifics of the applicant's responsibilities.
2. A "Partnership Agreement" is issued describing the actual work to be completed and the responsibilities of the applicant and FUND, Inc.
3. Applicant accepts or denies the "Partnership Agreement"
4. Project is scheduled and completed.

BASIC APPLICANT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Must demonstrate an understanding of "Neighbors Helping Neighbors" mission.
- Participate in on-going projects (before and after your project is completed.)
- Provide a meal for volunteers on your project day.
- Recruit family and friends to assist on your project.
- Provide a portion of the material costs of your project (amount is determined by FUND, Inc. based on household income.)
- Allow FUND, Inc. to use pictures and names from your project for public relations and fundraising purposes.
- Must have valid Homeowner Insurance Policy in place at time of your project.
- Agree not to hold FUND, Inc. or any volunteer liable for any action that may result in injury during the course of your project.
